Definition: VOLUNTARY (adjective)

- ▶ 1. done, given, or acting of one's own free will.
- ▶ PHYSIOLOGY under the conscious control of the brain.
- ▶ 2. working, done, or maintained without payment.

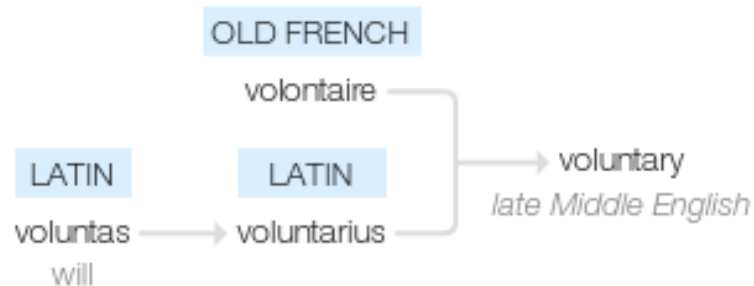
