Definition: FLAGRANT (Adjective)

- ▶ (of an action considered wrong or immoral) conspicuously or obviously offensive.



Use in a sentence:
FLAGRANT

▶ "a **flagrant** violation of the law"



Use in a SUBJECT

Unobtrusive

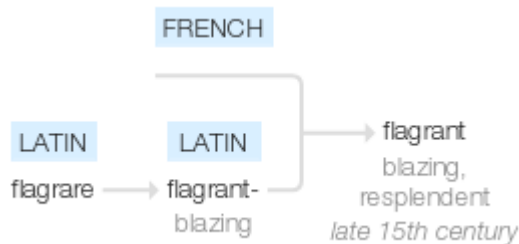
Slight

Etymology: FLAGRANT

- ▶ The etymology (history/origin) of FLAGRANT is:



- ▶ late 15th century (in the sense 'blazing, resplendent'): from French, or from Latin *flagrant-* 'blazing', from the verb *flagrare* .
