## Studio Grammaire

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Did you notice that there are four words for 'the' in French?

**le** = the (for masculine nouns)

**la** = the (for feminine nouns)

**les** = the (for plural nouns)

**l'** = the (in front of nouns starting with a vowel)

If the noun starts with a vowel, **le** or **la** becomes **l'** as in **l'ordinateur**.

## Studio Grammaire

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The word for 'some' in French is **des**.

*Dans mon sac, il y a des livres.*

In my bag, there are some books.

## Studio Grammaire

It is important to remember accents when writing in French. Three accents can appear on the letter 'e':

**é** – the acute accent eg **écoutez!**

**è** – the grave accent eg **élèves**

**ê** – the circumflex eg **la fenêtre**

## Studio Grammaire

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To make a noun plural add **-s** as in English. Listen again to exercise 3. Did you hear that the **-s** on the end of the word is not pronounced?

## Studio Grammaire

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Remember that not all words simply add **-s** to make the plural form. Watch out for:

**les tableaux** = the boards

**les bureaux** = the desks

## Studio Grammaire

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Did you notice that there are two words for 'a' in French? All nouns are categorised as either **masculine** or **feminine**.

**un stylo** a pen

**une gomme** a rubber

Did you notice that the months and days in French do not have capital letters?
